#### 1. INTRODUCTION

This report summarises the findings of the **Community Open Day Event** held in the Village Hall on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> June 2023.

The event was held as part of the community engagement process that will inform the preparation of our Community Action Plan 2023 – 2028.

The event was organised and promoted by the CAP steering group with the support of Ardoch Development Trust's Development Worker Bridie Grant.

Over 230 people attended the event – to view the results of the community engagement work so far, and to vote for their priority projects and actions and share their ideas for the future.

Thanks to all the volunteers, local 'theme champions', home bakers, local groups, the school, face painters, children supervisors, Ardoch Strings – and everyone that came and took part.

The report is 'verbatim' feedback of the comments and the votes at each theme table.

THEME 1: LOCAL ECONOMY AND VILLAGE ENHANCEMENT

includes 5 votes from children	Services to Support Work and Employment	<ul> <li>Faster fibre broadband – support for local business</li> <li>Broadband in Braco is awful if you can get online it often fails halfway through a task</li> <li>Joined up/concerted effort/ADT funding to improve broadband across the community **</li> <li>Before and after school childcare in the village</li> <li>Wrap around childcare to support families to access work and school</li> <li>Before/afterschool childcare desperately needed</li> <li>New school/investment threatened by school numbers – demography illustrates lack of families attracted to Ardoch. For some families lack of before/after school club is a blocker (Work with Muthill? Support from ADT?</li> <li>Greenloaning School – Community Work Hub?</li> <li>Co Working Space</li> </ul>

Raj is excellent and provides a great service to the community this should be recognized, and it would help if he had better premises and support *</li> <li>Don't need more shops but more people going into local grocery to support Raj and support local coffee shop.</li> <li>ATM would be useful</li> </ul>

85 Includes 7 votes from children	Roads and Traffic	<ul> <li>Need bumps traffic calming at the Bridge *</li> <li>Put speed cameras up and fine them (daily if necessary)</li> <li>20mph in village before somebody dies!!</li> <li>Reduced speed limit in Greenloaning have had too many scares!</li> <li>30mph in Greenloaning not 40mph</li> <li>20mph throughout Greenloaning</li> <li>Zebra crossing on Front Street</li> <li>Pedestrian crossing necessary from Front Street to Gentle Croft – often Library and PO vans are parked in Gentle Croft</li> <li>Traffic calming in Feddal Road/cycle friendly</li> <li>So noisy on Front Street – lorries worst.</li> </ul>
